Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. **Zeeland Public Schools** offers healthy meals every school day. Current Legislation allows for all students to eat qualifying complete meals for free regardless of financial income. Each Student may eat one complete breakfast and one complete lunch for free each day.

MILK ONLY IS \$.60. This is charged to any student who takes only milk. It does not qualify as a complete meal, and it is considered a la carte. Students must have money in their account to take milk only or any other a la carte items (middle school and high school offer more a la carte choices). Per the MDE there is to be no charging for a la carte items to accounts without the funds to cover these items.

A qualifying complete meal must meet state requirements. There are five components offered to make up a "complete meal", protein, grain, fruits, vegetables, and milk.

For lunch three of the five components are necessary (one of them MUST be $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of fruit or vegetable) on your child's tray in order for it to qualify as a complete meal.

Breakfast also requires students to take three of the four components offered (one needing to be a $\frac{1}{2}$ cup fruit).

Your children may qualify for Child Nutrition and Education benefits including Rec, Technology, & Testing discounts, etc. We strongly encourage every household to complete the Child Nutrition and Education Benefits Application to see if they qualify.

This packet includes an application for Child Nutrition and Education Benefits (free or reduced-price meals), and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from the Food Assistance Program (FAP), Family Independence Program (FIP), or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced-price meals if your household's income is within the limits of the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced-price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Lana Kamer, 616-283-2645 or lkamer@zps.org for Homeless or Runaway. If you believe you qualify for Migrant, please call or email Matt Stoltz, 616-748-3003 or mstoltz@zps.org.
- DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Education Benefits and Child Nutrition Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Zeeland Food Service, 3333 96th Ave, Zeeland MI 49464.
- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you received carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact **the food service office at 616-748-3128 or** <u>foodservice@zps.org</u> immediately.
- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? Yes! You are encouraged to complete an online application instead of a paper application if you are able. The online application has the same requirements and will ask you for the same information as the paper application. Visit **zeeland.familyportal.cloud** to begin or to learn more about the online application process. Contact **the food service office at 616-748-3128 or** <u>foodservice@zps.org</u> if you have any questions about the online application.
- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year, through **October 10, 2024**. If your child attends Z-Quest, their application expires **October 1, 2024**. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not send in a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.
- 7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Please send in an application.
- 8. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- 9. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced-price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 11. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOULD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced-price meals.
- 12. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you <u>normally</u> receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime occasionally. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 13. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application or may not receive income at all.

Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will <u>also</u> be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you <u>meant</u> to do so.

- 14. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY; DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.
- 15. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper and attach it to your application. - 16. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for **Food Assistance Program (FAP)** or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office <u>https://newmibridges.michigan.gov/s/isd-partnershiplanding?language=en_US</u>.
